Minutes from the November 2, 2023 Meeting

Michael had these items for the group:

- The City Council voted down a pay raise for alderpersons and the mayor. Data from the Human Resources Department suggested current salaries are in-line with comparable communities; any salary increases would have to be effective after the April, 2024 election.
- The City budget is mostly complete with a hearing tomorrow (Tuesday, 11/7) and the budget vote to be held on the third Tuesday of the month (11/21). The budget includes a 2.4% increase which translates to approximately \$24 per \$100,000 of home value. The increase includes the cost to continue (the cost to maintain the same level of service, including for wages, inflation, etc.) as well as new items (including installing partitions in the Fire Department bunk house for women and a new administrative assistant who will be shared by the Police and Fire Departments due to an increase in public records requests).

Ann discussed the following the group:

• The County portion of the budget is almost complete with a final vote this Thursday (11/9). There is an overall increase in the total budget. The library requested the same budget amount for 2024 as they did in 2023. Since the library received 12% less than requested in 2023, the 2024 request is not an increase over the 2023 request. It is uncertain at this point what actual funding amount the library will receive.

• Ann discussed the decision made by North Central Health Care (NCHC) to transfer the administration of the Marathon County group homes to Opportunity Inc. The residential and day service programs in Marathon County provide adults with physical and developmental disabilities services such as supportive apartments, community-based residential facilities (CBRFs), and adult day services. Supportive apartment services are provided at Riverview Towers and Riverview Terrace in Wausau; residents receiving care and services in these programs will be able to remain in their current living arrangements and should receive the same level of service they previously did.

No officer was available to attend our meeting this month.

There were several questions from residents:

- After a question was asked about the change in administration of Riverview Towers and Riverview Terrace to Opportunity, Inc. Michael shared that he and Mayor Rosenberg met with the residents of hear their concerns about the change.
- A resident asked about if the warming shelter was open. Michael confirmed the shelter is open now (it is located in the Community Partnership Campus) and throughout the year for the unhoused.
- A question was asked about leaf pick-up. Michael told us that the pick-up is delayed by at least 1 week, possibly more.

As you may have heard on the news, the Common Council approved the city purchase of the two lots at 811 and 815 Grand Ave. This is the former Wausau Floral property. The purchase price was \$805,000, below the fair market value of \$875,000. Funding will come out of the 2024 debt issue.

The purpose of this property will be for the new home of the Wausau Fire Department's central station. The existing central station was built in 1962 and while still serviceable, has some significant issues and challenges in meeting the needs of a 21st century fire service. There is no planned start date for the construction of the new station. Acquiring the land is the first step in a project that will take several years to complete. Acquiring this parcel now assures that the Fire Department will have a new home that will best serve the residents of the city.

Each committee is making a plan, so I recommend visiting the Marathon County Board Calendar to see the agendas of the standing committees where you will find the various meetings and when each will be discussed.

I serve on the Human Resources, Finance, and Property committee. The following are a couple of areas that will likely continue to be a focus:

• Establishing policy around long-term debt management and analyzing the various fund balances (including the source, balance, use, restrictions, and existing policy centered around each).

• Continuing work on Tax Delinquent, County Properties, and Long-Term Facilities Plan, establishing goals, guidelines, and processes for dealing with each (especially divesting from vacant properties)
