February 26, 2024

1. Welcome and Introductions

Gisselman called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

2. <u>Public Comment</u> N/A

3. <u>Approve minutes of January 27, 2024 Meeting</u> Motion/second by Filtz/Wildman. Passed unanimously.

4. Presentation: Merrill to Wausau River Trail, Bill Bertram

Bill Bertram, a representative of IronBull and the Greater Wausau Prosperity Partnership, showed the committee the plans for the network of gravel road routes throughout Marathon, Lincoln, and Wood Counties. These would be signed and mapped routes. There is unused right of way from WPS that runs along the RR tracks between Wausau and Merrill. The River Bend group from Merrill has worked for a few years to develop this into a connection. The DNR is also interested in making it a state trail or route. The River Bend group, along with Lincoln County and Marathon County have engaged MSA to develop a plan for the route. That is expected to be complete in 2024. The surface would be a gravel similar to the Mountain Bay Trail. Helke asked if snowmobiles would be allowed. Bertram responded that the DNR and landowners have asked for non-motorized vehicles.

5. <u>Discussion: River Edge Trail extensions updates – Alley crossing closure</u>

Lynch updated the committee that the ARPA funding request was going before the Finance Committee the following night and if passed would go to Council in March for final approval. After approval a bid could be issued. The CISM committee at their February meeting approved the staff recommendation to seek public feedback on the closure of the RR alley crossing between 3rd and 4th Avenues south of Stewart Ave. Staff examined all the crossings in the city and came up with one viable option. This will be part of the petition to the OCR to open a new crossing for the River Edge trail on the former County Materials site. Staff will be sending out a letter to property owners and if necessary knocking on doors. Gerhards asked about the timeline for the petition process but that is unknown. Wildman asked if turned down could the City wait and petition again? Lynch responded that again that is unknown since this is something the City never does. Diny suggested getting credit for the closing of the private crossing. Lynch noted that it would be in the narrative of the petition but may not count in the actual process. Diny also asked about giving up the alley. The alley is not being vacated and would remain useful. Just not able to cross the RR tracks. Filtz suggested even if the trail crossing is denied the trail should be built along the river up to that point so people can utilize the trail and the land.

6. Discussion and Possible Action: Grand Ave & Thomas St intersection

Smith gave a presentation on the intersection of Grand Ave and Thomas St and the connection to the bridge. The current infrastructure for bikes presents a series of bad choices but it could be better. Smith used the streetmix website to visualize some possibilities. Committee was receptive to the ideas and noted their own issues in that area. Lynch shared that WisDOT had previously had plans to rebuild the intersection but that fell off due to COVID. There is likely to be a large infrastructure project through the intersection in either 2024 or 2025 would could be an opportunity to change some elements. Mueller noted that while restriping is cheaper then reconstruction there are further costs that are considered with design. Gerhards likes rethinking the design of the streets and thinks the River Dr intersection rebuild is maybe only useful if redoing the bridge. He felt the lanes on the bridge would be too narrow with bollards and not enough protection. Helke asked about hanging a path on the side of the bridge. Filtz noted there may be engineering challenges with that approach but a good idea to explore. Smith noted that the best place to cross the river was Thomas St but that really wasn't ideal.

7. Discussion and Possible Action: Infrastructure Priority List


Lynch showed the committee several documents that were from 2018-20 which listed priority bike/ped infrastructure and pavement markings. These lists were started by a previous planner but not continued. Having updated lists would assist Engineering staff in fitting projects into the annual budget or when other funding opportunities come up. The committee felt this was a good tool to have and that they could work on updating them. Wildman, Filtz, Hope, and Gerhards indicated a willingness to work on updating these lists.



Motion/second by Schmidt/Filtz to adjourn. Passed unanimously. Meeting ended at 5:40 p.m.






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AND BRIDGE FEASIBILITY STUDY CITY OF SCHOFIELD, MARATHON COUNTY, WI
