## Agenda Item 1 - Call to Order

Meeting called to order by Chair Bohlken at 4:45 PM

## Agenda Item 2 – Approval of Minutes from 9/23/23

Clark-Zavadoski motioned to approve minutes, seconded by Powers. Approved 11-0. Motion carried.

Agenda Item 3 – PUBLIC HEARING regarding reprogramming funds from the 2023 Outreach Park and 2022 Administration funds into an Acquisition/Housing Development activity

Time was provided to allow for public comment regarding the reprogramming of funds. Bohlken asked three times if any member of the public would like to speak regarding Agenda Item 3. No comments were received during this time.

## Agenda Item 4 – Close of Public Hearing.

No public comments were received. Bohlken closed the public hearing.

Agenda Item 5 – Discussion and possible action on reprogramming funds from the 2023 Outreach Park and 2022 Administration funds into an Acquisition/Housing Development activity

Stratz explained that \$100,000 had been awarded to the Parks Department for the development of Community Outreach park across from the Outreach Home that the Police Department had planned to build. However, since the Outreach Home project fell through, the park was no longer needed. As a result, Stratz requested that the funds be reprogrammed to support the acquisition, testing, and architectural fees for a new affordable multi-unit complex. Stratz also requested that \$90,000 in administrative funds be reprogrammed for the same project.

Powers motioned to approve reprogramming funds, seconded by Henke. Approved 11-0. Motion carried.

Ageda Items 6 – Development of a proposed statement of objectives and use of funds in connection with the City of Wausau Consolidated Plan for the 2024 Community Development Block Grant Program.

Stratz informed the committee of the estimated amount of CDBG funds expected from HUD was \$600,000 and reminded them that only 20% (\$120,000) could be allocated to Administration and only 15% (\$90,000) to Public Services, with no cap on Public Facilities. The committee then discussed the 2024 CDBG funding proposals presented on 10/19 and 10/23, as well as their scores on the scoring matrix. Following the discussion, the committee voted to recommend the following projects for funding:

- **\$** ADMIN \$100,000 CDBG Administration
- § HOUSING \$145,000 Acquisition
- HOUSING \$70,000 Homeowner Rehabilitation
- **\$** SLUM & BLIGHT \$95,000
- § PUBLIC FACILITY \$100,000 Curb Ramp Reconstruction
- § PUBLIC SERVICE \$15,000 − Faith in Action
- § PUBLIC SERVICE \$25,000 − Children's Imaginarium
- § PUBLIC SERVICE \$25,000 Granite House
- § PUBLIC SERVICE \$25,000 − Wausau Free Clinic

Ageda Items 7 – Review scoring page and discussion of 2023 Program year and evaluation of projects for Working Session on Tuesday, November 7, 2023.

The committee discussed the scoring matrix used to evaluate the 2024 CDBG applications. They focused on the effectiveness of the evaluation criteria, the weighting of criteria. Members suggested refining the criteria and adjusting the weights to better reflect program priorities. There were also recommendations for improving the checklist used during the review process, including clarifying instructions, adding criteria for project readiness, and simplifying the checklist to enhance efficiency. Stratz and Graff noted they would consider their suggestions and create a better evaluation form to be used for 2025.

As you will recall during the 2020 CDBG CARES III funding process, MCDEVCO was allocated \$100,000 towards Micro Enterprise activities to assist small businesses that were hit hard due to Covid 19 with forgivable loans. This amount, as well as the CARES I funds, totaled over \$436,000 that MCDEVCO was allocated to assist these endeavors. As of this time, \$43,875 has been sitting with no requests since the beginning of the year. We believe these funds can now be better utilized with the upcoming proposed building purchase with Catholic Charities.

In addition, in 2022 Homme Homes was allocated \$83,000 to be used towards the elevator upgrade for their residents at Forest Park Village. Due to several leadership turnovers, they have not been able to fundraise in order for this project to move forward in a timely manner. They are hoping this upcoming year they will be more successful and we may see another request from them. In the meantime, we need to reallocate these funds to make them more productive.

In my previous memo, it mentioned reprogramming these funds into the Acquisition/Housing Development fund and committing approximately \$200,000 to Catholic Charities to assist them in purchasing 740 Washington Street. We just had a meeting today with Catholic Charities of which they requested that this item be pulled out of consideration. They are no longer moving forward with that offer due to timing and the fast track of raising necessary funding raised and the property rezoned.

However, we are still requesting that the \$43,000 from the 2020 CARES III funds and \$83,000 from the Homme Home elevator project be reprogrammed into the Acquisition/Housing Development program. We have a few properties we are hoping to work with the County that will assist in the development of new housing units.
