Description of the Proposed Project [24 CFR 50.12 & 58.32; 40 CFR 1508.25]:

Projects will consist of necessary repairs/renovations of residential properties to increase energy-efficiency, correct safety issues, code-violations and/or incipit violations. Repairs can also address maintenance issues to maintain and/or improve the value of the property. Program will assist income qualified homeowners OR City-owned properties that need repairs before they can be placed on the market and sold to income qualified households that will utilize the property as their primary residence.

Approximate size of the project area: Not available at this time. Each project will consist of the city lot that the house sits on. Most City lots are 60' x 120'; however many lots in the City are non-conforming and may or may not be that specific lot size.

Length of time covered by this review: Funding affected by this review are 2018 - 2022 Housing Rehabilitation Funding and any revolving loan funds attached to those funding years. 2018 funds will be utilized after this review period has elapsed – approximately starting end of 2020.

Maximum number of dwelling units or lots addressed by this tiered review: Each funding year addresses approximately 8 - 12 dwelling units. With this review covering five years of funding, we anticipate no more than 75 units that will be addressed with these funds.


