





RE: 2010 Inspections Annual Letter

Being promoted to Fire Marshal in February has given me increased duties and responsibilities toward making the city's public building and places of employment safer and more accountable for correcting code violations. Reflecting back, I will say that 2010 was the most significant year in violation code compliance. Since the implementation of the re-inspection fee, we have seen a drastic drop in code violations and the need for continuous re-inspections. At year end, outstanding violations are those in court process, variances waiting for State approval, or properties in need of construction changes. Code updates which included the installation of carbon monoxide detectors in most existing commercial and residential buildings were met with very little, if any, opposition from owners. (Next year will include one and two family dwellings).

The Wausau Fire Department in partnership with the City Common Council agreed to discontinue the tank program due to the decrease in state funding and increase in the cost of supporting this program.

Our Fire Prevention Programs again this year were well received by the teachers and children. By spending the day at each school or education center, it gave the fire department personnel time to interact with the children and instill the fire prevention theme which gave the children knowledge, and even homework, to take home and share with their parents and siblings.

When you continue reading this 2010 Annual Report, you will find a breakdown of the inspection activities and fire prevention programs on pages 27 and 28.




