Minutes from the February 6, 2023 Meeting

Officer Ben Thurmann attended our meeting. No Briefing Sheet was available this month and no one had any questions for Officer Thurmann.

Michael discussed the unhoused in Wausau.

• The unhoused population in Wausau has grown significantly during the last 4 years; the City is working with local agencies to assist those who are unhoused. This is a complex issue and the City Council will continue discussing it but they are limited in what short-term solutions they can implement. The Wausau Police Department established the position of Community Outreach Specialist last fall to assist the unhoused.

Ann spoke to us about several items.

• The "point in time" survey has shown an increase in the unhoused population. Social Services assists unhoused families. In addition, some private groups are helping pay for hotel rooms, etc., but certain resources are only available during daytime hours.

• Ann attended the Community Partners Campus (CPC) open house and shared what an excellent non-profit facility it is. Multiple local non-profits have office spaces in the CPC to assist members of our community in a single location.

Tara Glodowski, Executive Director of the Community Partners Campus was able to attend our meeting and provided an overall view of the CPC.

- CPC held an open house last week to showcase their shared non-profit space. Those non-profits include: Catholic Charities, Wausau Free Clinic, Blessings in a Backpack, Wausau Area Mobile Meals, The Neighbor's Place, The Babies' Place, NC Community Action Program (NCCAP), Marathon County Human Services and North Central Health Care.
- The CPC building one floor with 25,000 square feet and includes 2 hydroponic walls. Those walls were recently "planted"; the items grown there will be harvested and given to the Market (The Neighbor's Place pantry) for distribution. CPC has a full working kitchen which can be used by occupants of the building and to help clients learn how to prepare meals, etc.
- The building is open from 8:00 AM 4:00 PM (or 4:30 PM). Each organization establishes their own hours, which may vary from CPC hours. Additional information about CPC can be found on-line at cpcwausau.org.

Our meetings are open to all Wausau residents and we often have people from other neighborhoods join us. Two candidates for the Wausau School Board, (Dr.) Gillian Battino (a physician) and Fred Tealey (a former teacher), were at the meeting. Each gave a brief introduction and answered questions. The remaining School Board candidates will be invited to join us at the March meeting.
